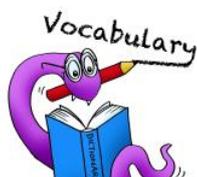


KS1 - What are Reading Vipers?

These are the key reading skills for children to be able read and comprehend a wide range of literary texts.



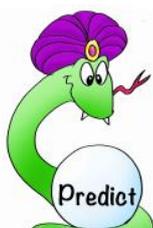
Vocabulary

What is suggested but not said in the text? Read between the lines and find the 'hidden' meaning.



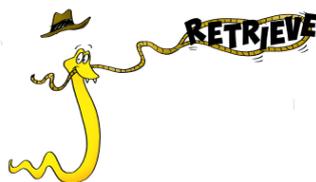
Predict

What might happen next based on what has happened in the text?



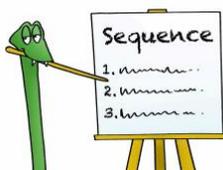
Explain

Retrieve information from the text to answer questions.

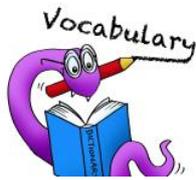


Sequence

What might happen next based on what has happened in the text?



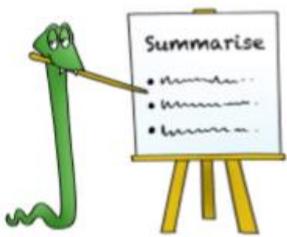
Explain

Retrieve

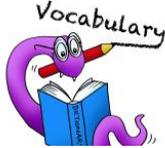
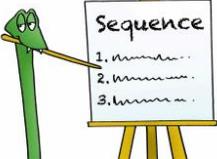
Retrieve information from the text to answer questions.



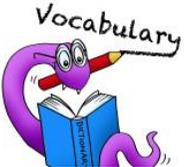
Summarise

Sum up key points in the text or sequence events as a summary.

KS1 VIPERS – possible question stems

 <p>Vocabulary</p>	<p>What does the word mean in this sentence? Find and copy a word which means</p> <p>What does this word or phrase tell you about</p> <p>Which word in this section do you think is the most important? Why? Which of the words best describes the character/setting/mood etc? Can you think of any other words the author could have used to describe this? Why do you think is repeated in this section?</p>
 <p>infer</p>	<p>Why was..... feeling.....? Why did happen? Why did say? Can you explain why.....? What do you think the author intended when they said.....? How does make you feel?</p>
 <p>Predict</p>	<p>Look at the book cover/blurb – what do you think this book will be about? What do you think will happen next? What makes you think this? How does the choice of character or setting affect what will happen next? What is happening? What do you think happened before? What do you think will happen after? What do you think the last paragraph suggests will happen next?</p>
 <p>Explain</p>	<p>Do you like this text? What do you like / dislike about it? Is there anything you would change about this story? Who is your favourite character? Why? Would you like to live in this setting? Why/why not?</p>
 <p>RETRIEVE</p>	<p>What kind of text is this? Who did.....? / Where did.....? / When did.....? / Why did happen? / How did? What happened when.....? How many.....? What happened to.....?</p>
 <p>Sequence</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 2. 3. 	<p>Can you number these events 1-5 in the order that they happened? What happened after</p> <p>What was the first thing that happened in the story? Can you summarise in a sentence the opening/middle/end of the story? In what order do these chapter headings come in the story?</p>

KS2 VIPERS – possible question stems

 <p>Predict</p>	<p>From the cover what do you think this text is going to be about? What is happening now? What happened before this? What will happen after? What does this paragraph suggest will happen next? What makes you think this? Do you think... will happen? Yes, no or maybe? Explain your answer using evidence from the text.</p>
 <p>Explain</p>	<p>Why is the text arranged in this way? / What structures has the author used? What is the purpose of this text feature? / Is the use of effective? The mood of the character changes throughout the text. Find and copy the phrases which show this. What is the author's point of view? What affect does have on the audience? How does the author engage the reader here? Which section was the most interesting/exciting part? / How are these sections linked?</p>
 <p>RETRIEVE</p>	<p>How would you describe this story/text? What genre is it? How do you know? How did...? / How often...? / Who had...? Who is...? Who did....? / What happened to...? / What does.... do? What can you learn from from this section? Give one example of..... The story is told from whose perspective?</p>
 <p>Summarise</p>	<p>Can you number these events 1-5 in the order that they happened? What happened after? / What was the first thing that happened in the story? Can you summarise in a sentence the opening/middle/end of the story?</p>
